Students, please note that it is your responsibility to double-check the information in the advisement form. Additionally, the catalog specifies the following information related to a program of study: 1) Complete the chosen program of study with the grade of "C" or better in all courses listed under the major, including those listed as Lower Division Major Requirements; 2) Complete a minimum of 123 semester hours with a minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.0 on all course work attempted at KSU. No course may be counted more than one time in meeting the total credit hours required for the degree; 3) For this degree, you must complete at least 30 semester hours in residence at Kennesaw State. At least 20 of the last 30 semester hours preceding graduation must be earned in residence. In addition, 24 semester hours of the upper level major requirements must be earned in resident at KSU.
