Course Description

The course examines law enforcement's response to domestic and international terrorism. Topics include: understanding the terrorist mindset, extremism groups, special-interest/anarchist groups, managing domestic terrorism, the role of intelligence, terrorist financing, concept of threat assessments, legal issues, and case-study analysis.

Course Objective

- Determine the causes of terrorism.
- Identify the current terrorist threats to the United States.
- Demonstrate an understanding of international and domestic terrorism groups; their methodology; their behavioral analysis; their techniques; and their objectives.
- Identify the financing, costs, and equipment needs of terrorist groups.
- Identify intelligence gathering and counter-intelligence techniques for terrorist groups.
- Describe the future endeavors and expectations of terrorist groups.
- Prepare a case study with a threat analysis of a terrorist group and present findings to peers.

Course Requirements

Students complete two examinations and prepare a research/writing requirement.

Exam One - Lecture material, films/video, and chapters 1 through 9.

Exam Two - Lecture material, films/video, and chapters 10 through 15.

Research/Writing Requirement with Presentation: Students prepare a case study with threat analysis on an assigned terrorist group. The paper will be a minimum of 1500 words. Each student prepares and presents a 10-minute briefing on their research.

Exam Make-Up Policy - If you miss an exam, call or email me. I will work with you to complete the requirement. You must complete a make-up within one week of the date of the scheduled exam.

Weather - If weather prevents us from meeting, follow the schedule and continue your reading or research. Check the KSU Web-Site and listen to the radio. The bottom line: use common sense; I do not want anyone hurt. Safety is EVERYONE'S responsibility.

Grading

Your final grade reflects your performance on examinations, research/writing requirement, class participation, and attendance. Your final score is calculated using the following guide:

Research/Writing Requirement with Presentation

Your learning goal for this paper is to determine if your erudition from this course is found in an in-depth case study. Your research/writing requirement is a threat assessment of a terrorist group. You will receive a lecture on threat assessments which will also guide you on this requirement. Use the APA writing style and a minimum of four references: two academic sources and two additional credible media sources. Wikipedia is not a trusted source; however, their list of books and references may provide direction. Use a 12-point font; staple in top left corner (no cover, spines, or notebooks); number your pages.

Research Guide Your paper documents: the history, the goals/ideology, the mission(s) and events, the victims, the movement (growth/decline), the financing, and the future of the group. Include in the threat assessment: capability and probability factors, violence potential, weapons gathering/damage potential, cellular structure, training, target identification methods, vulnerabilities, and consequences of intervention.
